HOLIDAY PET SAFETY

Nobody wants an emergency visit to the vet.
Take a look and follow these simple steps.



HUMAN FOODS



Keep the food for the humans out reach of your pet and ask your guests to do the same. Place small bowls with dog treats around the house to make it easy to grab and give to your dog instead.



CANDY & TREATS

Make sure your pet doesn't have access to candy & treats, especially those containing chocolate, xylitol, grapes, raisins, onions, or other toxic foods.



BUT THE HOUSE SMELLS SO GOOD...

Don't leave your pet alone in the room with lit candles, a decorated tree, or potpourri.



FLOWERS & PLANTS

Holiday plants such as holly, mistletoe, and lilies are toxic and should always be kept out of reach of pets.



SAFE, QUIET PLACE

Provide a safe place for your pet to escape the excitement such as a crate, scratching post shelf or hiding place. If your pet is excitable or scared, consider putting your pet in another room with some toys and a comfortable bed.
